



Nomination and Voting Process

- In April and May, the Executive Committee of the CAC2 Board of Directors will assess nominations for this year's annual election of the Board of Directors.
- Candidates selected for the slate will be announced in the CAC2 June Announcements.
- Voting will be conducted on Thursday, June 23, 2022, during the CAC2 members' business meeting at the Annual Summit.
- Only Individual Members and the Voting Representative from Childhood Cancer Organization Members are eligible to vote.
- Written voting proxies are allowed for members not in attendance at the members' business meeting at the Annual Summit in June.
- Each member of CAC2 entitled to vote shall indicate support for, or opposition to, the slate of nominees.
